Mobile phones and safeguarding

Many children are gaining access to mobile phones from a much younger age than they have been previously. Our digital world is ever-changing which in turn brings more online intelligence and risks for our children.

It has been brought to our attention this week that mobile phones are not always being used responsibly by children who have these. Please can you ensure that if your child has a mobile devices that these are being closely monitored and parental controls are enabled where possible to ensure our children are as safe as possible.

Glasses

Many of our children at Kellington wear glasses to support their vision. This may be all the time or for more focused work. It is important that these are in school everyday so that this is not a factor

impacting on your child's ability to learn. We are aware of which children need glasses however, understand that this will change as their prescription does.

Please could you let school know if your child no longer requires glasses or if they now need them. If these are not in school, we will call to ensure they are brought in so your child has the best chances of being successful.

RWI Online Reading Tool

All children who access phonics in school have log ins for the RWI online reading tool. This online platform gives children practise opportunities to apply their phonics and show you how amazing they are.

For Year 1 children, they will be doing the Phonics Screening Check in June. It would be really beneficial if the children had additional opportunities to practise their reading skills.

Uniform

We have high expectations in all aspects of school life and this begins with how our children are presented. We want children to look smart and to be proud of their school.

- Grey/black trousers/shorts/skirt
- White/royal blue polo shirt logo optional
- Sweatshirt/cardigan with/without school logo
- · Black, grey or white socks or tights
- Black school shoes (not trainers)
- Optional blue checked summer dress

PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD'S UNIFORM IS CLEARLY MARKED WITH HIS/HER NAME.

Book bags and PE kit bags are all available with the school logo which can be purchased from our uniform suppliers.

PE kit

- White T-shirt
- Black shorts
- Pumps/trainers

Children can wear tracksuits for outdoor PE during cold weather.

PE kit should be kept in school during the week and taken home for washing on a Friday. Children may only wear football kits for after school clubs such as football.

Jewellery and Make-up

For safety reasons no jewellery should be worn in school, with the exception of watches. If ears are pierced, only stud earings must be worn, but they must be removed or covered with plasters/tape by the child for PE. Nail polish or make-up of any kind is not allowed. If worn children will be asked to remove it.

Hair

Children's hair should be neat and tidy at all times. Children with long hair are required to wear it tied back for reasons of health and safety (e.g. in PE lessons) to prevent it from distracting their vision and to help prevent the spread of head lice. Hair bands/bobbles must be small and in school colours. Children are not allowed to wear elaborate hair decoration or other styles of a generally inappropriate nature for school (e.g. unnaturally coloured or with shaved lines or symbols.)
